

THE GOSPEL READING Good Shepherd Sunday

The Gospel passage for the Fourth Sunday of Easter is always from John 10. In this chapter Jesus refers to those who believe in him as his sheep and calls himself the good shepherd. He declares that he protects his sheep and leads them to eternal life.

Shepherds

People accustomed to seeing or managing flocks and herds would have easily understood Jesus' pastoral imagery. In the Old Testament God's relationship to his people was readily compared to a shepherd tending his sheep (see Psalm 100:3, Isaiah 40:11, and Ezekiel 34:11f).

Many Jews also expected the Messiah to be a descendant of David. David was a shepherd before God chose him to be king of Israel (1 Samuel 16:10f). The Messiah would shepherd the people on God's behalf (Ezekiel 37:24f and Micah 5:3).

When Jesus compares his relationship with believers to that of a shepherd tending his flock, he implicitly says that yes, he is the Messiah. He acts on God's behalf. Those who reject him, like those who are now questioning him, don't belong to him or to God.

"The Father and I are one."

The Father sent Jesus to reveal his (the Father's) love. Jesus perfectly does what God wants. Jesus and the Father are thus unified in what they want to happen and in what they accomplish.

The sheep are those who hear Jesus' words, see his signs, and believe in his power to give life. No one who accepts Jesus can die or be led astray because no one is greater than God the Father. Because Jesus does exactly what God wants him to do, God fulfills his promises to both shepherd and sheep and brings the sheep into eternal life. As a sign of his saving power, Jesus brings Lazarus back to life in the next story in this Gospel (John 11).

These verses in context

Although we hear these consoling verses during the Easter season, the Gospel-writer placed them in a very different feast day. Jesus is in Jerusalem to celebrate the Jewish defeat of a pagan overlord (v.22). As Jews celebrate this past military victory, some ask if Jesus is also such a messiah (v.24).

Jesus accepts the title but goes on to claim a unity with God that many Jews understandably heard as blasphemous. The already tense exchange between Jesus and those who question him thus takes a dangerous turn. Having faced suspicion and rejection, Jesus now contends with outright violence (v.31). This exchange between Jesus and his opponents points ahead to his trial and death.

Fr Peter's Sunday Reflection

Theme: I am the Good Shepherd

Dear friends in Christ, we are privileged to be among the chosen people of God through Christ who John 13:1 pointed out that Christ so much loved those who were his own in the world, he loved them to the end. It was on account of this love that He laid down his life as a shepherd for his sheep. This is because it is only the true shepherd that will lay down his life for his sheep, a mere servant may not be able to do such for he is there only for his wages. Christ is our true shepherd, not only did he fight to protect us but has to give up his life, for our sake.

A true shepherd is he who knows his sheep by name and also knows their various strengths and difficulties. A good shepherd must leave the rest and go in search of the one gone astray Luke 15: 3~7. So, It was the intention of Christ to protect all that his father has given him that none be lost as such he reconciled us back to God. In John 13:1~7 he condescended to the level of a servant to wash our feet, a gesture that was only reserved for the slaves. This he did just to show us an aspect of true leadership, a true shepherd.

Many of us found ourselves in leadership positions of various kinds, how are we a true leader and a shepherd to those entrusted to us? In the family, what does your parenting vocation look like, do you raise your children in fear of God or did you just overlook them to act indifferent? Those in the leadership role in the Church have the same question to them. When the leaders act in a good manner and respect each other, the people will always be motivated and enabled to do the same. Let us all be guided.

Pope Francis speaking of good shepherds said "The good shepherd listens to the flocks, guides the flocks, and takes care of the flocks. One of the signs of the Good Shepherd is meekness. In addition, a good shepherd is tender; he has that tenderness of closeness, he knows the sheep one by one, by name, and he takes care of each one as if it were the only one, to the point that when he returns home tired after a day of work, and realizes that one is missing, he goes out to work again in search of that one, and carries it back home with him, on his shoulders (Lk 15:4~5). This is a good shepherd

Athletic Directors Report: •No baseball this week due to flooding at the field.
•Planning for a basketball camp and a soccer camp (scheduled for the summer) is underway.

Development Office and ICSSO:

•Preparation for the annual Charity Fair is currently underway. •Bake sales to raise funds for 'buddy benches' for the elementary playground are being held. •A hanging basket sale will be held closer to Mother's Day.

2025-2026 Budget Discussion •In this session we (conservatively) estimated 15 students in both Pre-K and Kindergarten. We increased staff salaries and tuition by 3%; and Chris Monte and Bruce Davis have reviewed and approved all expenditures in the budget. A motion was made and accepted the 2025-2026 budget as presented, all approved.
